

How the Constitution Got In the Way of Your Freedom

I once tried to find the law of freedom in the Los Angeles County Law Library much like you would find the law of contract. I found nothing. Aside from the acknowledgement of self evident truths in the Declaration of Independence there's no written law that says how you are free.

You are free to the extent there are no written laws that apply to you. Written law is merely a literal expression of what is fact. Article IV of the Articles of Confederation required the States to recognize the freedom of free inhabitants. Article IV is still binding on the States.

This is where the Constitution of the United States comes in. it is claimed that the Constitution of the United States replaced the Articles of Confederation so that the people of the States would be subject to the law making power of the Congress of the United States

The Constitution of September 17, 1787 was ratified by the States and then the territory and other property belonging to the United States of America was substituted for "this Constitution" when George Washington took the job of President of the United States.

George Washington, as President of the United States of America, got first crack at the office of President of the United States job, because until Washington nominated someone to the Article II, Section 1 Clause 8 and Article II Section 1 Clause 5 Office of President, he could be "the President" and it would appear as if he had adopted "this Constitution," the Constitution of September 17, 1787, when on April 30, 1789, he took the oral oath of office of President of the United States.

What kind of Constitution do we have after George Washington gets elected President of the United States of America, takes an oral oath to be an employee of Congress, President of the United States? You get the kind of Constitution that appears to apply to all the American people, when President of the United States of America begins to "to take Care that the Laws be faithfully executed" according to Article II, Section 3 of the Constitution of September 17, 1787

What has changed after the Declaration of Independence, the Articles of Confederation and the Northwest Ordinance of July 13, 1787? The Constitution of September 17, 1787 was just a slight revision of the Articles of Confederation and the Northwest Ordinance of July 13, 1787.

The Constitution of the United States stands in the way of your freedom because it is believed to be the legal repository of legislative power over the American people.
